Program Description

The English Department was established in 1998 under the Faculty of Letters. In June 2014, the faculty changed its name into the Faculty of Language and Arts. The department was established as a response towards the growing needs of expertise in English language which also makes use of arts as a media of communication. The program was designed to produce graduates who possess oral and written competencies in English language, literature, and teaching. Students in this program can choose one of the two concentrations offered: linguistics and literature. Graduation from the program requires the completion of 144 credit hours during 3.5 to 4 years of study.
