# LAW

## Program Description

The Law program was established on 5 August 1982. The Law program received an A score from the National Accreditation Board of Higher Education. One of the missions of the Soegijapranata Catholic University Faculty of Law is "Development of law and legal science that is concerned with the environment and marginalized groups of society, especially women and children".

## Teaching Staff

The program is supported by 23 full-time qualified lecturers graduating from local or overseas universities. The vision of the program is "To be a learning community which encourages critical thinking in legal science".

## Facilities

The program has a Law Laboratory to train skills in legal practice. Lecturers in this laboratory are professionals such as public notary, judges, tax consultants and psychologists. The Soegijapranata Catholic University Law Laboratory is the first legal laboratory developed in Indonesia and has become a reference for other departments laboratory development at both private and public colleges.



## Curriculum

Graduates from the under-graduate program require the successful completion of 146 credits, consisting of 120 credits in compulsory subjects and 26 credits in elective courses. The course is designed to be completed in 8 semesters with a maximum of 14 semesters. Some students are able to complete their studies in just 7 semesters (3.5 years).

## Alumnae

The Law Department has more than 1000 alumnae. They are members of our alumnae's group, Ikatan Keluarga Alumni Hukum (IKAHUKUM). Graduates are working as judges, lawyers, notaries, lecturers, in addition to as workers in companies, banks, and government institutions.



## Cooperation

The Faculty of Law has formed partnerships with various institutions. Apart from overseas co-operations established by the university, these partnerships include:
